
Cover sketch by Danita Cole is an early view of Wauwatosa looking eastward up Harwood Avenue.

The industrial age turned the nation into a leader in manufacturing. The free enterprise system aided in the development of corporations that would reach across to Europe.


Immigrants were to make up what was to be called, "the melting pot." Each of their unique cultures and customs blended to form, "The American."
